Encourage them to focus on the problems and solutions in the text. Tell them that each student should say and write their question on the whiteboard. Remind them that a question mark is the correct punctuation at the end of a question. Have partners switch whiteboards to record their answers to the questions.

How to Ask Great Questions

In course planning, include notes about when you will pause to ask and answer questions. Asking questions throughout the class will not only make it more interactive, but will also help you measure and improve student learning. Do not wait until the last two minutes of class to ask for questions. Students are unlikely to ask questions when they know that only a few minutes remain. Question-response is a common form of guided oral practice. Nomination is often essential in this stage, but the traditional 'lockstep' pattern of interaction should be minimised by asking students to ask and answer questions in open pairs across the class and in closed pairs.

The question-answer relationship (QAR) strategy helps students understand the different types of questions. By learning that the answers to some questions are "Right There" in the text, that some answers require a reader to "Think and Search," and that some answers can only be answered "On My Own," students recognize that they must first consider the question before developing an answer.

Write a few sentences on the whiteboard. Ask which questions might have elicited this answer. For example: I usually take the subway to work. Possible questions: How do you get to work? How often do you take the subway to work? Split students up into pairs. The second exercise asks students to provide a suitable question for the response given.

Include some information questions, some that ask for conclusions, and some that ask for opinions. Encourage students to use their own reactions, feelings, perceptions, values and life experiences as starting points for discussion. Ask open-ended (divergent) questions — ones with many equally valid answers — to reduce potential anxiety students may feel about being wrong.

And when you're done, ask if you've answered the question. Repeat a student's question before you answer it. Be aware of the acoustics and that students sitting behind someone who asks a question might not hear it. In addition, by repeating it, you give the student a chance to indicate whether that was indeed the question he or she intended. If the question is a good one, say so. If the question is tangential, develop a nice way to say that.

Ask your question, then let the person answer it in full, even when you think you are not getting the answer you want. Listen fully to what they are saying and use that to direct them back to the topic in the next question when there is a natural pause.
